Cure Advocacy Network (CAN)

After months of work at the beginning of 2024, we got our \$3M SCI Research Grant bill introduced on the Assembly floor and brought to a vote. Just before midnight on February 22, 2024, our bill was passed: 93-3! Unfortunately, our legislation was not granted a vote on the Senate floor and we were unable to pass our bill during the remainder of the session. But we re-grouped and are poised to have our bill heard in the upcoming fall session of 2025.

Meanwhile, funding continues to be allocated toward translatable, functional recovery research in our other state legislative programs.

Highlights

- WI SCI Research Grant bill passed in the Wisconsin Assembly by a vote of 93-3
- Ongoing support from Paralyzed Veterans of America and the Wisconsin American Legion
- Governor Evers preliminarily agreed to put our bill in his proposed budget
- Planning for our national legislative campaign began at the end of 2024

SCI Consultants

For the past four years, U2FP has been placing individuals with a spinal cord injury into research labs as lived-experience consultants. These SCI Consultants - or "Lab Rats" as we call them - keep research labs focused on the practical implications of their goals. Our SCI consultants learn about the complex challenges facing research labs and their presence gives researchers real-time feedback on their targets and priorities.

Highlights

- Mackenzie Wann is working in Kristin Zhao's lab at Mayo Clinic on Spinal Cord Stimulation for improved autonomic function.



- Frank Acosta is working with Ladan Jiracek's startup IntimaStim at the University of Florida on male sexual function (ejaculatory).

**Note that female orgasm research is currently in development here as well.*



- Cole Sydnor & Mandy Mackenzie are working on a multi-lab collaboration with David Darrow, Phil Horner, Dimitry Sayenko and Alex Herman (University of Minnesota and Houston Methodist) studying the recovery effects of Psilocybin on individuals with SCI.



- Kent New, Marco Sorani, Chris Barr, Ian Burkhardt, Peter Nowell, Jason Biundo, Alexander Rabchevsky, Matthew Rodreick, et al all contributed to Dr. Jen Dulin's preliminary study, entitled "Funding distributions, trends, gaps, and policy implications for spinal cord injury research: A systematic analysis of US federal funds." This paper is currently being considered by the journal Neurotrauma.

Team U2FP

Team U2FP participants bring funds and awareness to the SCI movement for cures in a very specific way: the money they raise primarily supports our Cure Advocacy Network (CAN), where we train and mobilize SCI advocates to pass state legislation that funds curative research. We do this because it is extremely difficult to get grant funding for legislative advocacy, since it's technically considered political lobbying. Don't Leave Us Behind

SCIRP CUTS

In March of this year, the Federal Government eliminated the Spinal Cord Injury Research Program (SCIRP), which aims to find treatments for veterans (and all U.S. citizens) suffering from SCI. U2FP has been deeply involved with SCIRP, having referred staff and supporters to serve on their lived experience review panels, as well as inviting their Scientific Officers to speak at our Annual Symposium and be guests on our podcast.

Meanwhile, the trickle-down effect hit our state programs. Our flagship Minnesota legislation saw proposed cuts of over 80% - but we rallied the SCI community and were able to restore nearly all of the proposed cuts!

- Created a bi-weekly meeting of the leading SCI organizations
 - Crafted a unified statement
 - Saved Minnesota SCI/TBI Research Grant program from massive cuts
 - Rock to Restore Research concert fundraiser
 - Created a Save SCIRP resource webpage
 - Included the restoration of SCIRP into our national legislative campaign
 - Planning a Congressional Briefing in DC this fall to advocate for SCIRP
 - Just secured a Senate Sponsor from the Majority Party

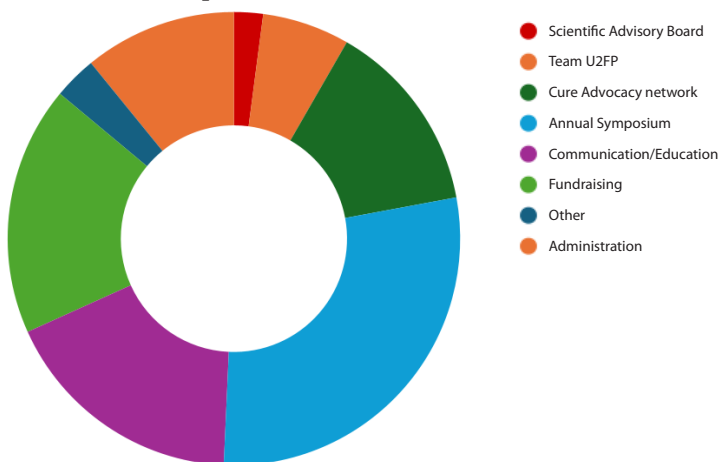

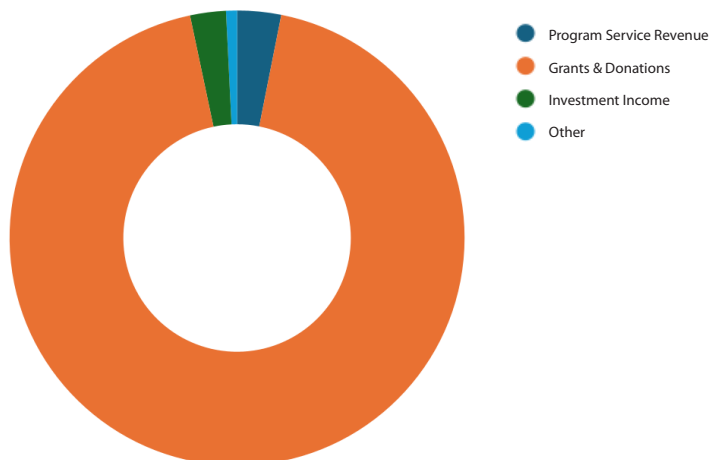
